** Si prevedono proteste in vista della visita di Isaac Herzog a Melbourne ** Almeno 20 persone uccise da un ciclone in Madagascar *** Il presidente israeliano Isaac Herzog dovrà affrontare un'altra giornata di proteste mentre la sua controversa visita in Australia volge al termine. Herzog sarà circondato da una stretta sorveglianza da parte della polizia del Victoria, alla quale sono stati concessi poteri speciali di perquisizione in base alla legislazione antiterrorismo. Una protesta programmata nel centro di Melbourne dovrebbe attirare migliaia di persone, ma secondo la polizia la manifestazione si svolgerà in modo pacifico. Herzog è stato invitato in Australia dal governo federale dopo l'attacco terroristico di Bondi, ma ha ricevuto critiche significative dai manifestanti filopalestinesi e da alcuni politici per le azioni di Israele a Gaza. Almeno nove persone sono state denunciate lunedì nel centro di Sydney e 27 arrestate dopo che i manifestanti sono stati picchiati e spintonati dalla polizia quando una manifestazione contro Herzog è diventata violenta. ***	** Protests expected ahead of Isaac Herzog's visit to Melbourne ** At least 20 people killed by a cyclone in Madagascar *** Israeli President Isaac Herzog is expected to face another day of protests as his contentious Australian visit nears an end. Mr Herzog will be closely guarded by police in Victoria, who have been granted special search powers under terrorism legislation. A planned protest in Melbourne's C-B-D is expected to draw thousands, with police saying the demonstration is expected to remain peaceful. Mr Herzog was invited to Australia by the federal government following the Bondi terrorism attack but has received significant criticism from pro-Palestine protesters and some politicians over Israel's actions in Gaza. At least nine people were charged in Sydney's C-B-D on Monday, and 27 arrested after protesters were punched and pushed by police when an anti-Herzog rally became violent. ***

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La vice leader dei Verdi Mehreen Faruqi ha condannato la decisione del governo Albanese di ospitare il presidente israeliano Isaac Herzog durante una protesta davanti al Parlamento federale a Canberra. Si è rivolta a una folla di attivisti per criticare la decisione del governo laburista e il recente comportamento delle forze dell'ordine a Sydney. La senatrice ha espresso il suo profondo disappunto per gli standard etici dell'attuale governo, chiedendo al contempo un cambiamento radicale nella politica estera. "War criminals belong in prison, not in Parliament. I have long lost respect for the Albanese government, but never in even my wildest dreams could I have imagined that they could reach such such a low not only to invite Isaac Herzog here, but to honour him." *** Almeno 20 persone sono state uccise da un ciclone in Madagascar, mentre la nazione isolana dell'Oceano Indiano è alle prese con l'impatto devastante della tempesta. Il ciclone Gezani ha attraversato la costa orientale con venti costanti di circa 185 chilometri all'ora e raffiche che hanno sfiorato i 270 chilometri all'ora, abbastanza potenti da strappare le lamiere dai tetti e sradicare alberi di grandi dimensioni. Prima dell'arrivo del ciclone, le autorità hanno chiuso le scuole e si sono affrettate a preparare rifugi di emergenza.	Greens deputy leader Mehreen Faruqi has denounced the Albanese government's decision to host Israeli President Isaac Herzog during a protest outside Federal Parliament in Canberra. She addressed a crowd of activists to criticise the Labor government's decision and the recent conduct of law enforcement in Sydney. The Senator expressed her deep disappointment in the current government's ethical standards while calling for a total shift in foreign policy. "War criminals belong in prison, not in Parliament. I have long lost respect for the Albanese government, but never in even my wildest dreams could I have imagined that they could reach such such a low not only to invite Isaac Herzog here, but to honour him." *** At least 20 people have been killed by a cyclone in Madagascar, as the Indian Ocean island nation grapples with the storm's devastating impact. Cyclone Gezani tore across the east coast with sustained winds of around 185 kilometres per hour, with gusts nearing 270, powerful enough to rip metal sheets off rooftops and uproot large trees. Ahead of the cyclone's landfall, authorities closed schools and rushed to prepare emergency shelters.
