** Dopo mesi di speculazioni, arriva l'accordo su una serie di riforme ambientali da approvare in Parlamento ** Una donna morta e un uomo ricoverato in ospedale a seguito dell'attacco di uno squalo su una spiaggia isolata del New South Wales *** Il primo ministro Anthony Albanese ha raggiunto un accordo con i Verdi per rivedere la legge sulla protezione dell'ambiente e la conservazione della biodiversità (E-P-B-C). Dopo mesi di speculazioni sul fatto che il governo avrebbe raggiunto un accordo con i Verdi o con la Coalizione, la serie di riforme dovrebbe essere approvata oggi dal Senato. Le modifiche sono volte ad accelerare il processo decisionale per le questioni prioritarie a livello nazionale, come le energie rinnovabili e l'edilizia abitativa, e, allo stesso tempo, ad aumentare le sanzioni per le violazioni e ad eliminare le controverse esenzioni per il disboscamento ad alto impatto ambientale e gli accordi forestali regionali. Albanese ha dichiarato che queste riforme erano attese da tempo. "More than five years after Professor Graham Samuel handed down his independent review into the nation's 25 year old environmental laws that were widely acknowledged as not being fit for purpose, the government's Environment Protection reform bill will be passed by the	** After months of speculation over a deal, a suite of environment reforms to pass through parliament ** A woman dead and a man in hospital after a shark attack on a remote New South Wales beach *** Prime Minister Anthony Albanese has secured a deal with the Greens to overhaul the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation, or E-P-B-C, Act. After months of speculation regarding whether the government would strike a deal with the Greens or the Coalition, the suite of reforms is expected to pass through the Senate today. The amendments are designed to speed up decision-making for national priorities such as renewable energy and housing, and simultaneously, increase penalties for breaches and removing controversial exemptions for high-risk land clearing and regional forest agreements. Mr Albanese says the reforms have been a long time coming. 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Senate today." *** Una donna è morta dopo essere stata attaccata da uno squalo in una spiaggia isolata sulla costa centro-settentrionale del New South Wales. La polizia ha riferito che altri bagnanti hanno tentato invano di soccorrerla nelle prime ore di questa mattina, prima dell'arrivo dei servizi di emergenza presso una spiaggia del Crowdy Bay National Park, a circa un'ora a sud di Port Maquarie. Un uomo è sopravvissuto all'attacco ed è ricoverato in ospedale in condizioni critiche. Entrambi avevano circa vent'anni, ma non sono stati ancora identificati. *** Tre persone sono state arrestate in relazione al violento incendio che ha devastato diversi grattacieli nel quartiere Tai Po di Hong Kong, il più grave incendio che abbia colpito la città negli ultimi anni. Le fiamme hanno continuato a divampare per tutta la notte, causando almeno 44 vittime e lasciando centinaia di persone disperse. Alcuni residenti hanno trovato rifugio in un centro sociale nelle vicinanze, e molti di loro sono in preda al panico per la sorte dei propri familiari e amici. Lawrence Lee era al lavoro quando è scoppiato l'incendio e ha perso i contatti con sua moglie, che spera disperatamente sia sana e salva. CANTONESE TRANSLATED TO ENGLISH: "My wife	Senate today." *** A woman is dead after a shark attack at a remote beach on the New South Wales mid-north coast. Police say that fellow beachgoers unsuccessfully tried to help her before emergency services arrived at the beach in the Crowdy Bay National Park, about an hour south of Port Maquarie, early this morning. A man has survived being bitten and is in hospital in a critical condition. Both were aged in their 20s but are yet to be identified. *** Three people have been arrested over a massive blaze at several blazing high-rise apartment blocks in Hong Kong's Tai Po district, the city's deadliest fire in years. The blaze has burned through the night, leaving at least 44 people dead and hundreds unaccounted for. Some residents are sheltering in a nearby community centre, many frantic about the whereabouts and wellbeing of family and friends. Lawrence Lee was at work when the fire broke out and has lost contact with his wife, who he desperately hopes is safe. CANTONESE TRANSLATED TO ENGLISH: "My wife
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is still in the flat. When the fire started, I told her on the phone to escape. But once she left the flat, the corridor and stairs were all filled with smoke and it was all dark, so she had no choice but to go back to the flat."

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
